GENERAL INFORMATION:

Any attempt at fraud or plagiarism results in a 0/20.

Students are given a mark between 0 (minimum) and 20 (maximum) for each course. Course assessments are any of the following: written tests, oral examinations, oral presentations, written reports, laboratory experiments, or experiment reports.

Courses are grouped together to form a 'course unit'. Each course unit is worth a pre-determined number of credits in the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS).

The final mark for a course unit is calculated from each course evaluation. If the mark for a course unit is greater to, or equal to 10/20, the ECTS credits are awarded.

Course assessment, 'course unit' weighting, and ECTS credits are specified in Esigelec's Course Catalog for the current year.
